• Jan Willem de Groot . I. Tree calculates the benefits of trees. We all know that the larger the canopy of a tree the higher the ecosystem services are. Trees in our cities are planted with a purpose. We want them to develop into large, healthy and safe trees that provide us the optimum ecosystem services. But, just planting a tree doesn't make it successful! If we want our new planted trees to be successful one day, we need to give them the right tree management. Based on his experience in The Netherlands Jan Willem de Groot will give a presentation about young tree management based on a plan.

Dale Mortimer has been the Tree Service Manager for the London Borough of Ealing since 2011. He has a Higher National Diploma in Arboriculture and a BSc in Social and Community Forestry. After graduating Dale spent five years on the tools as a climbing arborist before becoming an Arboricultural Officer with the London Borough of Wandsworth. He has been an active member of the LTOA for 12 years

participating in working parties including PR, Massaria, OPM, Bio-Security and Contract Procurement. He wrote Ealing's first Tree Strategy in 2013 and recently tendered the Councils arboricultural contract in a rather creative eleven Lot package; which sought to encourage more interest from small businesses



Rob Scholefiled

Rob has a background in countryside management, horticulture and arboriculture and has worked in the Housing Sector for nearly 20 years in both practical and managerial roles. He currently manages more than 25,000 trees in the southwest of England for LiveWest – a Registered Housing Provider managing over 35,000 homes from the Isles of Scilly to Gloucester.



Richard Barnes

Richard is a Chartered Landscape Architect leading a small multi-disciplinary design team at Newcastle City Council. He has a particular interest in sustainable urban trees planting and management of existing trees, particularly in association with highway and other developments in the public realm.

IHwe has been involved in the design and implementation of several successful schemes where innovative and new techniques have been employed to overcome potential difficulties with establishing trees in paved areas.

He wrote of a document – Highway Tree Design Guide – that acted as an advisory document for NCC highway engineers and developers where new trees could be included in development schemes. IHe is the lead officer for the iTree project currently underway in the City and part of the team revising the Tree Strategy
